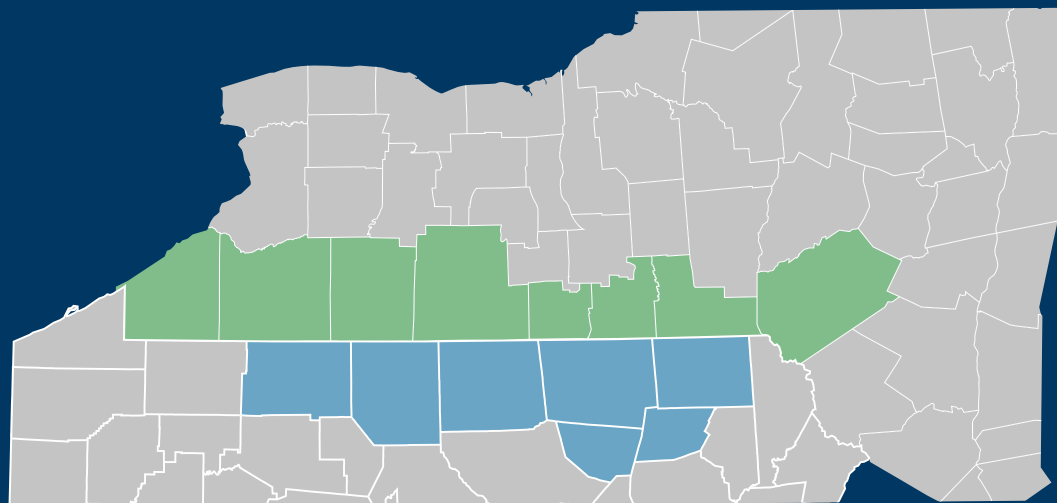
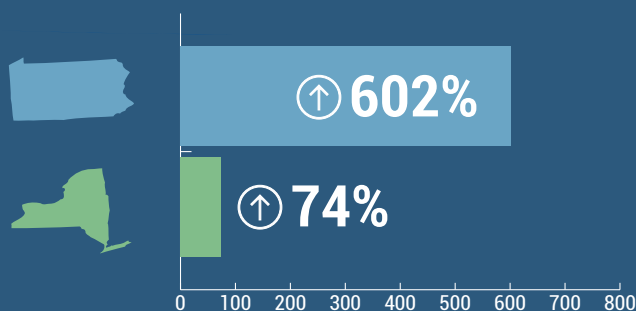


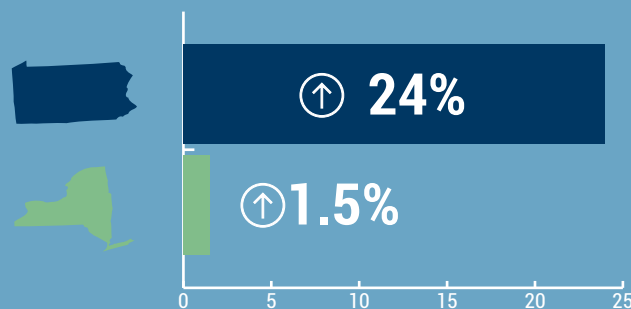
# Thanks to New York's Fracking Ban, "Twin Tiers" Now Look More Like Distant Cousins
